
## Pretrial Services Snapshots

Pretrial Services employees work at many locations: the Harris County Jail, the probable cause hearing courtroom, Houston Police Department's Central and Southeast jails, and the Criminal Justice Center. These offices are open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.


## The Defendant Report

The department compiles reports on defendants charged in Harris County for Class B misdemeanor and greater offenses. The report contains the defendant's criminal history, demographic information, education and employment status, and an assessment of the defendant's risk of pretrial misconduct. The Pretrial Services defendant report facilitates informed decision-making throughout the pretrial stage of a case, beginning with bail review at the probable cause hearings and throughout subsequent appearances before the assigned court. Pretrial officers present the report to the magistrates conducting probable cause hearings; copies are delivered to the assigned courts and the information contained in the report can be viewed online. Other, authorized criminal justice personnel can view the report's information online as well.


## The Risk Assessment

After the pretrial officer has conducted a defendant interview and performed a criminal history investigation, the pretrial officer uses the information compiled in the defendant report to complete the risk assessment.





Felony Defendant Representation at Different Risk Levels

*The final risk level for a defendant takes into account both mitigating and aggravating factors when appropriate. Overrides of the scored level occurred in 4.4% of risk assessments. Over 87% of overrides were assessed because the defendant had an active hold placed by Immigration & Customs Enforcement. An ICE hold changes a defendant's risk level to High.*



## Defendant Report Activity




Arrests were down in 2010 compared with 2009 by almost 6% with the greatest decrease in felony arrests which were down 13.6%. There were a total of 98,922 arrests in 2010 with 63,151 people whose most serious charge was a class A or B misdemeanor and 35,771 people arrested for a felony offense. Defendants charged with felony offenses accounted for 36.2% of arrests and misdemeanors 63.8%.

The department compiled 87,009 defendant reports on incarcerated defendants, or 88% of the arrest population. Staff prepared 53,986 reports on defendants arrested solely for a misdemeanor offense, compiling information on 85.5% of that population. For those defendants arrested for a felony, the percentage was over 92.3%, or 33,023 reports completed.

Other defendants interviewed included 1,262 defendants who posted a financial bond and were interviewed after release in order to initiate

court-ordered supervision and 44 interviews conducted with defendants who had an open warrant, usually on a motion to adjudicate or a motion to revoke probation. Abbreviated versions of the defendant report were prepared for 120 defendants, most of whom were ordered to submit to a point-of-collection drug test but did not have a current defendant report on file and were not going to be supervised by the department.




## 2010 Brought Changes to Supervision Services

In August 2010, the Harris County Attorney's Office informed Commissioners Court, "That we do not find a statutory basis for pre-trial services to work on matters not related to personal bonds" and the department, "may only work on matters related to personal bonds." In September the Commissioners Court instructed the County Attorney to convey this opinion to Pretrial Services as well as to the Criminal District Court judges and the County Criminal Court at Law judges.

The County Attorney's office agreed with Pretrial Services that the courts needed some time to implement alternative means of supervising defendants on a surety or cash bond. For more than fifteen years the courts relied on Pretrial Services to monitor defendants on cash or surety bond that were required to abide by certain conditions of release.

Over time, defendants on financial bond comprised the majority of the department's supervision caseload and represented more than 90% of the defendants with additional conditions of release. The County Attorney's opinion reversed an established practice that affected the courts and the department. To facilitate transition, the department stopped taking new cash or surety-bonded defendants for supervision on October 18, 2010, but maintained a caseload of defendants already under supervision until the beginning of the new fiscal year - March 1, 2011. Most of the cash and surety-bonded defendants under supervision in October left the department through attrition - mainly by case disposition.

Defendants Ordered Supervised by Bond Type




The size of the cash and surety-bonded caseload actually began decreasing at the beginning of the fiscal year that began March 1, 2010. At that time the department had already been subject to a hiring freeze for six months and experienced a 3% reduction in its operating budget for the funding cycle that was just beginning. The department had to implement practices commensurate with the budget constraints.

Because 95% of available funds were needed to support labor and benefits, there was

less money available for drug testing and electronic monitoring services. A corresponding decrease in the number of defendants to whom the department could provide services ensued. The department expects to have sufficient supervision resources during the next fiscal year to address the requirements of defendants released on personal bond.

## Supervision Caseload Review

While the number of defendants granted a personal bond in 2010 decreased 5% from 2009 to 5,559, so did arrests. Personal bond releases as a percent of arrests actually increased to 5.62%. And even before the County Attorney's opinion suspended supervision of cash and surety-bonded defendants, the number of personal bonds exceeded the number of financial bonded defendants placed on supervision in every month in 2010.



A look at the 9,114 defendants placed under supervision by the judiciary last year shows 4,922 defendants or 54% had standard, contact requirements. The remaining 4,192 defendants (46%) were ordered to comply with one or more of the enhanced conditions.

This represents a 30% decrease from last year in defendants requiring more intensive supervision. Defendants with financial bonds accounted for 84% of defendants ordered supervised with enhanced conditions. The overall decline in the intensive supervision caseload is attributable in large part to the cessation of financial bond defendants placed under supervision.

For defendants with enhanced conditions, drug testing was most frequently ordered. Over 72% with enhanced conditions were ordered to submit to drug tests. Only 12.4% of those ordered tested for drug use were on personal bond.

The next condition most often imposed overall was installation of a breath-alcohol monitoring device either in the form of an ignition interlock device installed in a vehicle or an in-home device. Of those with enhanced conditions, 52.4% had a breath-alcohol monitoring order. Personal bonds accounted for 5% of those with a breath-alcohol monitoring condition.

The courts also ordered 9.6% of supervised defendants to wear electronic monitoring devices. The device allows Pretrial Services to determine whether a



defendant is complying with a court-ordered curfew by monitoring his or her proximity to a transmitter attached to a telephone in the defendant's home.

A count of the number of defendants on supervision on the last day of each month gives a snapshot of the size of the supervision caseload throughout the year. In 2010, the caseload averaged 1,916 active defendants on supervision, down over 33% over last year. In September 2010 (the last full month where financial bond defendants were accepted) the percent of the caseload that had enhanced conditions was 66.9%. By December 2010 that percent dropped to 42.9%.





## Drug Test Activity

Screening for drug use remains the condition most often imposed by the judiciary as a condition of pretrial release. Most defendants are tested using a random test procedure. The defendant does not know whether he or she will be tested until the day of the test. For defendants not supervised but determined by a judge to need a drug test, the department conducted onsite point-of-collection tests (POCT) which test for five categories of substances and deliver immediate presumptive results.

Pretrial Services performed drug tests on 4,355 people in 2010, a 39% drop from 2009. Revisions to the drug test protocol, one of the changes made by the department in response to the budget issues facing the county, reduced both the number and frequency of defendants tested for drug use. Of the defendants tested, 457 (11%) were on personal bond and 3,193 (73%) were under pretrial services supervision on financial bond. The remaining 705 people (16%) were ordered tested by the courts but were not supervised. The remaining 7 defendants tested were under supervision where bond was not a factor, including persons with modified sentences and summonses. The standard drug test protocol for supervised defendants with a drug test condition is to use a POCT for the first test. All subsequent tests are sent to a laboratory for analysis.

In 2010, there were 2,838 first-test POCT specimens collected and tested on site. An additional 1,050 onsite tests were conducted at the request of the court and 718 of those were on defendants who were not under the supervision of the



department.

A total of 8,783 specimens were collected and sent to a laboratory for analysis. The department also administered 57 breath analysis tests using a device that assesses breath alcohol concentration from a breath sample, and applied 9 transdermal patch tests on defendants who could not provide a urine specimen.

The overall positive rate was 24% compared with 27% in 2009. In 2010 35% of defendants tested positive for drug use on the first test and only 23% were positive by the third test.

## Conclusion of Supervision Period

In 2010, 10,190 defendants exited the Pretrial Services supervision program. They included 5,475 defendants on personal bond, 4,664 defendants on financial bond, and 51 people who were not on bond or who had out-of-county cases.


The median time under supervision for personal bond defendants was less than for financial bond defendants. Moreover, while financial bond defendants had longer supervision periods, they did not go to court as frequently as defendants on personal bond. Defendants on financial bond averaged fewer than 2 court appearances per defendant per month while defendants with a personal bond averaged 2.4 court appearances per month.

A review of the 10,139 defendants with a personal or financial bond shows that 81%, or 8,223 defendants, completed the supervision period and left the program because their criminal case was over. Looking at these defendants by offense level, there were 7,144 defendants with a misdemeanor case and 2,995 with a felony case. Of those who left the program because their case was resolved, defendants with misdemeanor charges included 17% with jail time, 58% with no additional jail time, and 25% dismissed. Of defendants charged with a felony, 19% were ordered to jail or prison, 54% received no additional jail time, and 27% saw their cases dismissed or no-billed. The most common sentence imposed included some form of community supervision with 46% of all misdemeanor and 49% of all felony cases resulting in post-trial supervision.


The remaining defendants had their supervision period end before the disposition of their criminal cases. Defendants who missed a court appearance, and whose bond was revoked or forfeited, accounted for 7% of the total. Noncompliance with other conditions of supervision (e.g., refrain from substance abuse and abide by curfew restrictions) represented 7% of those who left the program. The remaining 5% exited for reasons other than noncompliance.

Of the 51 people with a non-bond or out-of-county case, 94% successfully completed the supervision period.


Personal Bond



Financial Bond




Status of Warrants Issued in 2010 on Cases With a Personal Bond



Status of warrants issued in 2010 for personal bond cases as of February 15, 2011. A status of 'Other' includes warrants returned unexecuted or where the defendant posted a new bond. Of the 611 warrants issued on personal bond cases during 2010, 79% have been resolved. A pretrial investigator attempts to locate fugitives and, working with law enforcement, facilitate apprehension for those cases not resolved by reinstatement.





### 2010 Annual Personal Bond




### 2010 Annual Financial Bond




## Felony Supervised Cases by Charge Category
