

New Defendant Report Manager Introduced

The department introduced a new online defendant interview in June 2013. The new interview, called JPIN, has many features long desired by the department.

The JPIN project gave Pretrial Services the opportunity to revisit and refresh the information collected during the defendant interview. The design allows for greater control of the data collection process and improved quality control.

The printed defendant report produced from JPIN was designed in consultation with judges and magistrates and it presents the information in a more readable, accessible format. The defendant report is also available online to authorized users via the ITC Report Portal.

JPIN is part of the ITC Integrated Justice Project to retire mainframe programs and was the first project by the ITC Justice Applications team to use .NET programming to build a web-based application. The partnership among the many stakeholders and the development team successfully delivered a long sought replacement for an aging mainframe-based program.

Risk Assessment Enhancements

Another new application for risk assessments, recommendations, and court activity was developed in tandem with JPIN by the Pretrial Services Computer Applications Division.

The risk assessment program uses information gathered during the defendant interview and subsequent criminal background checks to measure a defendant's probable risk to re-offend or fail to appear. The risk tool uses both dynamic (social/economic) and static (criminal history) factors to assess risk.

Once the risk level has been determined, a recommendation whether to release a defendant on personal bond is made using a recommendation matrix that takes into account both the risk level assigned by the risk assessment tool and other mitigating or aggravating factors. Each time a judge or magistrate reviews a defendant's report and risk assessment for a personal bond, it is documented and the decision regarding release on a personal bond or continued detention is recorded.

Director Retires



She was a pioneer in exploring solutions to the growing segment of the arrest population who suffer from mental illness, having served on the State of Texas advisory board working on criminal justice and mental health issues. She has won numerous awards in her field, most recently being recognized for her years of distinguished public service and commitment to the goals of pretrial justice by the Texas Association of Pretrial Services.









Defendant Information

The department compiles reports on defendants charged in Harris County with Class B misdemeanor or greater offenses. The report contains the defendant's criminal history, demographic information, education and employment status - factors that contribute to an assessment of the defendant's risk of pretrial misconduct. These factors, along with the defendant's risk assessment score, contribute to the department's release recommendation. The Pretrial Services defendant report facilitates informed decision-making throughout the pretrial stage of a case, beginning with bail review at the probable cause hearing and for subsequent appearances before the assigned court. Pretrial officers present the report to the magistrates conducting probable cause hearings; judges in the assigned courts receive a hard copy and can also view the report online. Other authorized criminal justice personnel can view the report's information online as well.



The number of interviews decreased along with the number of arrests; however, the percent of the arrest population interviewed by the department with suspected mental health issues continues to grow.

Defendant Report Activity




Arrests for new offenses were down again in 2013. Since the record high number of arrests in 2009 (104,766), bookings are down over 16% and they are down 2.4% from 2012. The number of defendants arrested for a felony offense in 2013 matched the number arrested last year. Misdemeanor arrests were down 3.8% from last year.

There were a total of 87,966 arrests in 2013 with 55,324 people whose most serious charge was a class A or B misdemeanor and 32,642 people arrested for a felony offense. Defendants charged with felony offenses accounted for 37% of arrests and misdemeanors for 63%.

The department compiled 72,804 defendant reports on incarcerated defendants, screening 82.8% of the arrested population. Staff prepared 44,308 reports on defendants arrested solely for a misdemeanor offense, compiling information on 80.1% of that population. For those defendants arrested for a felony, the percentage was 87.3%, or 28,496 reports completed.

Other defendants interviewed included 38 defendants who originally posted a financial bond and were interviewed after release for consideration for a personal bond and 47 interviews conducted with non-incarcerated defendants who had an open warrant, usually on a motion to adjudicate or a motion to revoke probation. In addition, 53 interviews were conducted for performance, appeal, and witness bonds.

The introduction of the new interview application, JPIN, had an effect on the number of interviews conducted in 2013. The number of interviews that staff could conduct was lower than normal as they adapted to the new system. Once the employees became familiar with JPIN their productivity assumed normal levels.




Risk Assessment

The scores obtained from the risk assessment instrument range from 0 - 17 points. Higher risk scores are associated with increasing probabilities for pretrial misconduct (failure to appear in court, re-offense).

Point Range	Risk Level	% Rate of Misconduct
0 - 3	Low	Less than 10%
4 - 5	Low-Moderate	12% - 14%
6 - 7	Moderate	17% - 24%
8 and above	High	Greater than 29%


The final risk level for a defendant takes into account both mitigating and aggravating factors. Overrides of the scored level occurred in 3.1% of risk assessments. Over 99% of the overrides were done due to aggravating factors. The most frequently used reason to raise the risk level was the placement of a detainer on the defendant by Immigration & Customs Enforcement, which accounted for 56% of overrides that were applied for aggravating circumstances. An ICE detainer changes a defendant's risk level to High because a defendant with an ICE detainer may be released to ICE and not be available to appear in court.

Percent of Defendants in Each Risk Level Whose Supervision Ended Due to Non-Compliance




Scored risk levels are consistent with actual misconduct rates of defendants.

Supervision Caseload Review

In 2013 a total of 4,598 defendants either were released on a personal bond or remained on a personal bond when their participation in a pretrial intervention or diversion program began. Most of these defendants, 4,087, were released for a new case and placed under active supervision. Almost 72% of those with a new case had a low or low-moderate risk level at the time the personal bond was granted while 24% had a moderate risk level and 4.3% scored as high risk. While arrests on a new case fell 2.4% in 2013 compared to 2012, there was a 13.5% decline in personal bond releases on a new case.


Other defendants released on personal bond include 99 defendants whose appearance was required in court on a motion to adjudicate or revoke probation, appealed a case disposition, or were given a bond for a specific length of time after judgment was entered on a case before the execution of the sentence (performance bond).

For defendants supervised for a new case, 3,169 defendants, or 77.5%, had standard release conditions. The remaining 918 defendants (22.5%) were ordered to comply with one or more additional release conditions.

The most frequently ordered additional condition was the requirement to submit to drug testing, affecting 54.4% of defendants with additional conditions.

The next condition most often imposed was installation of a breath-alcohol analysis device either in the form of an ignition interlock device installed in a vehicle or an in-home device. This condition was placed on 18.3% of

the defendants with additional conditions.

The courts required 22 supervised defendants (.5%) to observe a curfew. Of those, 7 defendants were ordered to wear an electronic monitoring device. The device allows Pretrial Services to determine whether a defendant is complying with the court-ordered curfew by monitoring his or her proximity to a receiver attached to a telephone in the defendant's home.

Defendants who receive pretrial intervention or diversion are still on bond until the diversion or intervention program requirements are fulfilled. Defendants under the department's supervision who subsequently receive pretrial diversion or intervention usually remain on a personal bond while participating in these programs. Additionally, the courts may replace the surety or cash bond of some defendants entering these programs with a personal bond. The department is responsible for notifying the defendants of any court dates where the defendant must be present and, therefore, communicates with the defendant on a monthly basis to verify contact information. During 2013, 349 defendants were monitored in this manner. An additional 63 defendants with a motion to adjudicate or revoke probation were granted a personal with no supervision by this department other than to assure appearance in court.

Throughout 2013, the average number of defendants actively supervised or monitored by the department was 1,488 defendants. This is a 30.4% decrease in average caseload size compared to 2012. Defendants released on personal bond for a new case comprised 76.1% of the average caseload; those monitored while in a CSCD program were 22.4% of the caseload, and the remaining 1.4% were on a performance bond, appeal, or motion to revoke or adjudication probation with pretrial services supervision.


Standard Release Conditions

- In-person reporting on each court date*
- Contact by phone at least every two weeks*
- Calls the day before court to confirm court date*
- Notification of all address, telephone number or employment changes*
- Permission requirements for travel out of the Harris County area*

Additional Release Conditions

- Submit to random drug tests*
- Install and use deep lung breath analysis devices*
- Adhere to a curfew with or without electronic monitoring*
- Abide by residence requirements*
- Seek or maintain employment*
- Seek or maintain attendance in education program*
- Participate in substance or alcohol use treatment*
- Participate in mental health services*

Drug Test Activity





The department uses a screening device, a point of collection test (POCT), to test defendants reporting for the first drug test after release. All subsequent specimens are sent directly to a laboratory for analysis.

The department tested 677 defendants in 2013 performing a total of 2,471 drug tests. That is 12.6% fewer defendants tested than last year and an 11.2% decrease in the number of tests.

There were 543 first-test POCT specimens collected and tested on site. A total of 1,895 specimens were collected and sent to a laboratory for analysis with 390 specimens, or 20.6%, testing positive.

Overall, the positive rate on the first test, usually a POCT, was 58.6%. The percent positive decreased after the first test for an overall positive rate of 29.3%.

The department has a deep lung breath analysis device on site to use in those instances when a court suspects a defendant appearing in court is intoxicated. This only happened on 4 occasions in 2013.

The department scans the index finger of a defendant reporting for a drug test and submits it, along with the defendant's system person number, to the Sheriff's Department automated fingerprint identification system (AFIS). Pretrial Services then receives a picture associated with those items and uses the picture to ensure the correct person reported for a drug test.

Conclusion of Supervision Period

There were 4,186 defendants under active supervision with a new case who exited supervision in 2013. Of those, 3,810 were charged with a misdemeanor offense and 376 had a felony offense.


Of the 3,810 misdemeanor defendants whose supervision period ended, 73.2% were not further incarcerated, 18.8% because their case was dismissed. Jail time was the sentence imposed on 9.3% of the remaining defendants. Another 16.9% had their bond revoked for non-compliance issues, 9.3% for failing to appear for a scheduled court date and 7.6% for non-compliance with conditions (e.g., do not use drugs, abide by curfew restrictions). Fewer than 1% exited supervision for other reasons.

Of the 376 defendants charged with a felony, 65.4% received no additional jail time, 31.4% because their case was dismissed or no-billed. Another 4% of defendants charged with a felony were ordered to jail or prison. Noncompliance claimed 27.4% of defendants charged with a felony, 7.7% for failing to appear in court and 19.7% for violating the conditions of release. The remainder, 3.2%, exited for reasons other than noncompliance (e.g., personal bond replaced, bond was for a specific time period).

The most common sentence imposed included some form of community supervision, especially for misdemeanor cases with 42.2% entering a CSCD program. For defendants with a felony charge, CSCD supervision barely edged out dismissal or no bill as the most frequent sentence at 32.2% of all felony defendants exiting Pretrial Services supervision.

Defendants whose bonds are revoked for


Disposition of New Cases



non-compliance are no longer part of the active supervision caseload; however, their cases are assigned to an FTA investigator who locates fugitive defendants with outstanding warrants. Over 70% of all FTA warrants issued in 2013 were resolved by February 15, 2014.

Another 92 defendants who were monitored by the department while appealing a case disposition, addressing a motion to adjudicate or revoke probation, or who were released after pleading guilty but before the imposition of a sentence saw their supervision end in 2013 - 95% successfully. Of 974 defendants enrolled in a CSCD program, 66.2% completed their diversion program or had a motion to revoke dismissed while 33.8% had their case adjudicated.

Only the bond attached to the initial arrest and release is reported. Defendants who subsequently have a warrant






Defendants Released on Personal Bond to Pretrial Supervision for a Misdemeanor Offense




Defendants Released on Personal Bond to Pretrial Supervision for a Felony Offense





by Risk Level





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






Supervision End Reason for Defendants with a Misdemeanor Case
